

VCASS MUSIC AUDITION INFORMATION

Before you start your online application to audition, we recommend you watch our auditions checklist video :

VCASS Auditions

All VCASS audition applications will be submitted as a video. This video will be uploaded directly to our online application portal.

Subsequent Rounds

If needed, subsequent auditions/interviews will take place face to face online or face to face onsite at VCASS.

AUDITION APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Watch the checklist video

2. Assemble all required PDF or JPEG documents no bigger than 5MB

- Copy of Birth Certificate
- Small photo (can be a JPEG)
- Current VISA documents (if applicable)
- Copy of Semester TWO report from previous year
- Student Statement -(around 200 words) Why would you like to attend VCASS?

3. Record one unedited MP4 format video no bigger than 400MB

- See the requirements outlined in this document below
- Pausing a video between songs is not considered as an edit

This video must include:

- A spoken introduction stating your name, current year level, program you are applying for and a brief summary telling us about yourself
- Specific illustrations/demonstrations of your skills in line with the audition requirements below
- 4. Complete online application
- 5. Upload your video into application
- 6. Pay and submit your application

TIPS FOR PREPARING YOUR VIDEO

We expect most applicants will be filming in a quiet workplace setting, using whatever device they have at their disposal. Do the best with what you have and remember these tips:

• Present an introduction of yourself at the beginning – stating your name, year level, application number and chosen stream (brief one minute maximum)

- Film in a clear, well-lit space so we can see you
- Check the quality and / or sound of the image prior to submission
- Do not record outside of a building e.g. a park or garden with additional noise
- You must be visible in the video at all times
- Your video should be filmed in one sitting and not edited (pausing the video is permitted)

CONTENT OF VIDEO

Video footage must contain:

- Introduction
- A short solo technical study or work of technical focus
- Two favourite scales and one arpeggio
- Two contrasting repertoire works either with a live accompaniment or unaccompanied

If the applicant plays a "second instrument" then they may include video of one work on this instrument (counted within the video- not a separate video of the second instrument).

INSTRUMENTAL PROFICIENCY FOR VIDEO

Applicants are not required to undertake prior music examinations.

However, the following serves as a guide:

Piano (classical), Violin, Cello	Entering Years 7/8: AMEB Grade 6 Entering Years 9/10: AMEB Grade 7 Entering Year 11: AMEB Grade 8 Entering Year 12: AMEB Associate Diploma

Voice

Whilst vocal training is not mandatory, it is advisable applicants have received some vocal training within a choir or private lessons.

Guidelines for voice students are: Years 7, 8 & 9 will not enter as an improvisation student. If they are deemed to be a suitable candidate for VCASS, the early voice pathways are focused on voice building.

MUSIC THEORY KNOWLEDGE

Formal music theory tuition is not mandatory; however, the following serves as a guide:

<u>Year 7:</u> AMEB Grade 1 <u>Year 8:</u> AMEB Grade 2 <u>Year 9:</u> AMEB Grade 3 <u>Year 10:</u> AMEB Grade 4 <u>Years 11 – 12:</u> AMEB Grade 5 or VCE Music Performance Units 1 & 2

Auditioning students may be required to sit a music theory and aural assessment as part of the audition process.

Whilst there is no expectation that an applicant is highly skilled on a second instrument, presentation of one work on an additional instrument may be appropriate.

ACCOMPANIMENT

Typically, applicants auditioning on piano, guitar, drums and percussion may not need an accompanist.

If your two performance pieces have accompaniment, we recommend you use an accompanist.

For a list of freelance accompanists refer to the <u>Victorian Music Teachers' Association</u> website.

Recorded accompaniment is **not** permitted. The following instruments have **specific audition requirements**:

Voice	Vocalists must sing without amplification.
	Recorded accompaniment is not permitted.
	All vocalists should select a work that displays your middle and upper register.
	It is important to sing without force.
	Non-Improvising Vocalists
	Entering Year 7-9: at least one song should be selected from any book from AMEB Grade 1-4 Singing Series 2, or <i>ABRSM Songbook</i> , Books 3-5.
	Entering Year 10-12: at least one song should be selected from "26 Italian Songs and Arias: Authoritative Edition by Paton, or a comparable song in Italian, French or German.
	Improvising Vocalists
	Include a technical study/ vocalise (performing a transcription of a jazz solo may be used to fulfill the 'technical study' requirement).
	One of the following jazz standards :
	 Swing - Autumn Leaves, All The Things You Are, In Walked Bud Latin - St Thomas, Black Orpheus, Gentle Rain Ballad - Alone Together, In a Sentimental Mood, God Bless the Child
	Plus, one contrasting jazz style work of your choice.
	The applicant should also be prepared to improvise over a 12 bar blues progression and a ii-V-I chord progression.

One Technical Study (from any period). (Performing a Baroque work (c.1600-1760) may be used to fulfill the 'technical study' requirement).
One Classical work (c.1730-1820)
Plus, one work of your choice from any period.

Improvisation Applicants	Include a technical study/ vocalise (performing a transcription of a jazz solo may be used to fulfill the 'technical study' requirement).
	One of the following jazz standards :
	 Swing - Autumn Leaves, All The Things You Are, In Walked Bud • Latin - St Thomas, Black Orpheus, Gentle Rain Ballad - Alone Together, In a Sentimental Mood, God Bless the Child Plus, one contrasting jazz style work of your choice. Please note, effects pedals are not permitted.

Drum Kit	Drummers must play with sticks and brushes and demonstrate a variety of feels and grooves including Latin, Swing, Ballad, Funk and Jazz Waltz.
	Technical work must include basic drum rudiments, plus one solo from the book <i>The All-American Drummer</i> by Charley Wilcoxon.
	In addition prepare two contrasting well known jazz standards :
	 Swing - Autumn Leaves, All The Things You Are, In Walked Bud Latin - St Thomas, Black Orpheus, Gentle Rain Ballad - Alone Together, In a Sentimental Mood, God Bless the Child
	Double kick pedals are not permitted.

Percussion If invited to attend a follow up audition, Percussion applicants must email <u>music@vcass.vic.edu.au</u> to confirm which instruments, if any, you require us to provide at your audition (i.e. classical snare, marimba, vibraphone). You need to bring your own sticks and mallets.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

- After viewing your video and reading your application, the panel may request a follow-up audition/interview. This will be either at VCASS or online
- Auditionees receive an email advising them of their outcome. If unsuccessful, you are most welcome to audition again in the future
- The outcome of the audition is final and not subject to appeal
- The school does not provide any feedback to applicants regarding their audition.
