

VCASS THEATRE ARTS AUDITION CRITERIA 2019

ENTRY INTO YEAR 11, 2020

Audition and interview

Key Dates

Workshop auditions and interviews will be scheduled in the week of August 26, 2019.

Audition Location

- All music auditions are held at VCASS, 57 Miles Street Southbank.
- There is no parking available on the premises. The closest car parks are at the Arts Centre and the Australian Ballet Centre. There is also secure parking at 21 Bank St South Melbourne.

Audition requirements

- Applicants must arrive at least 15 minutes before scheduled audition time.
- Applicants will participate in a group workshop audition followed later in the day by an individual interview.
- On audition day, all applicants must bring a **copy of your Semester 1, 2019 Reports**.

Audition Format

Workshop Audition

- The workshop audition will be of 60 minutes duration.
- This consists of a group workshop, a short text exercise and a short self-devised piece.
- Both the text exercise and self-devised piece will be presented in the workshop audition.
- On the day, applicants should be appropriately dressed for the workshop audition. Either 'theatre blacks' or loose comfortable clothing will be acceptable.
- Applicants should bring a water bottle and any hand properties or costume items necessary for their solo performance.

Interview

- The interview will be 10 minutes in length.
- Applicants will also have the opportunity to discuss their solo performance piece and explain the decisions they made in developing their work.
- In general students are invited to demonstrate their interest and commitment to learning about theatre with a specific focus on contemporary ideas and practices.
- Students should also be willing to discuss performances they have attended in the past twelve months as well as performers that inspire and motivate them.
- Applicants should note that it is not the policy of the school to give feedback on the audition and interview. A letter will be sent as soon as the process is complete advising you of your result.

Additional Information

What do I need to present in my audition?

The day will consist of two parts:

1. A group workshop
Short text exercise
Devised performance piece
2. Interview including a short, unaccompanied vocal performance

SHORT TEXT EXERCISE

- Choose **one** of the short text monologue pieces provided below and learn it for the audition.
- You will work with this material and will be required to present a part or all of the speech.
- When learning the speech take time to understand what is being said.
- We want to see how you connect with text and how you can draw character from the words provided.
- Don't get caught up in elaborate staging or searching for subtext.

SHORT TEXT MONOLOGUES

Helena

O, I am out of breath in this fond chase!

The more my prayer, the lesser is my grace. Happy is Hermia,
wheresoe'er she lies;

For she hath blessed and attractive eyes.

How came her eyes so bright? Not with salt tears: If so, my eyes are
oftener wash'd than hers.

No, no, I am as ugly as a bear;

For beasts that meet me run away for fear: Therefore no
marvel though Demetrius Do, as a monster fly my presence
thus.

What wicked and dissembling glass of mine Made me compare with
Hermia's sphery eyne?

Ophelia

O, what a noble mind is here o'erthrown!

The courtier's, soldier's, scholar's, eye, tongue, sword; The
expectancy and rose of the fair state,

The glass of fashion and the mould of form,

The observed of all observers, quite, quite down! And I, of ladies
most deject and wretched,

That suck'd the honey of his music vows,

Now see that noble and most sovereign reason, Like sweet bells
jangled, out of tune and harsh; That unmatch'd form and feature of
blown youth Blasted with ecstasy –

THE DEvised PERFORMANCE PIECE (Your Solo)

You will have a total of 4 minutes to set up, perform and pack away.
We will not be able to see any more than two minutes of any piece.

- This is your opportunity to create a performance piece that shows us something about your interests and abilities.
- The piece should combine the elements of theatre namely body, voice, image and object.
- A starting point for your piece might be a photo, painting, piece of music, poem or news article. Something of significance to you and which stimulates your imagination for performance.
- You might like to consider including some or all of the following in the piece: Text, Action, Objects/props/items of costume, Sound/live music, Fiction, Space, Senses

Remember, there are no right answers or approaches here. Take a risk, be as genuine as you feel you can. Keep it simple.
